To improve literacy and math skills as parent/caregiver your responsibilities will be to:

- Read to or with your child at home every day.
- Help your child learn their math facts at home by practicing them daily.
- Read classroom curriculum updates and family newsletters related to curriculum programs.

To support an environment in which students are prepared, healthy, and happy, the parent/caregiver responsibilities are to:

- Talk with your child about their day. (e.g. What was the best part of your school day?)
- Be sure that your child is in school every day on time (8:20-8:40 AM) and that they get enough sleep each night (e.g. 10-12 hours for K-2)
- Plan for your child to stay the full day and communicate dismissal changes to the office and your child before 2:20 p.m.
- Attend all goal setting and parent conferences, and/or PPT/Team/504 meetings.
- Complete all required school forms in a timely manner.
- Ensure that the school always has current telephone numbers and emergency contacts.
- Monitor your child's screentime.
- Encourage your child to get plenty of exercise, play time with same-age peers, and fresh air.

To increase overall student success and improve communication, the parent/caregivers' responsibilities will be to:

- Provide timely communication regarding your family and your child's needs and/or updates to information.
- Attend school events as possible.
- Read all school wide communications including the Weekly Family Update.
